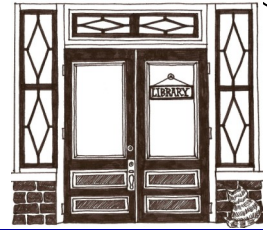

LIBRARY WELCOMES NEW DIRECTOR

The Benzonian Public Library recently appointed Sara Petrovich-Boven as the new library director: Sara replaces Marjorie Porter who retired in March.

Sara is a native of Traverse City and both she and her husband are excited about returning to the area where each has extended family.

They most recently lived in the Nashville, Tennessee area.

Sara brings a wealth of academic training and practical experience to her new role. She holds a bachelor's degree in English and

German from the University of Michigan; a masters degree in education from Aquinas College and a master of library science from Wayne State University. In addition, she received a Fulbright assistance honor to study in Vienna, Austria.

Sara has 15 years of classroom teaching experience and has worked in several library settings. She most recently worked in an academic/research library

During that time she expanded the collections, improved and expanded computer services and access for the public, and was instrumental in passing the county millage measure in 2011.

KEEPING YOUR CHILDREN SAFE

The Benzonian Public Library is dedicated to providing a warm, welcoming, exciting, and safe environment for people of all ages. It is for the safety of each child that the Library has adopted this Safe Child Policy.

The safety of children left alone in the Library is a serious concern of the Library staff. The staff, however, has many duties to perform in order to serve all patrons. The Library staff and volunteers are not responsible for monitoring the safety and behavior of children in the Library, on Library grounds, or participating in Library activities. The responsibility for the safety and behavior of children in the Library rests with the parent/caregiver. Parents are advised that, even in their absence, they are legally responsible for their child's behavior.

All children age 10 and younger must be accompanied at all times by an adult or an adolescent at least 14 years of age while on Library premises.

Children ages 10-14 may use the Library unattended provided they maintain proper Library behavior and that the Library staff and volunteers has been informed of how to contact the child's parent/caregiver.

Young people 14-17 are treated as adult users. However, they are still legally the responsibility of their parents.

Library staff and volunteers who observe unacceptable behavior on the part of a child (whether or not accompanied by a responsible adult), will give the child a warning that they must correct their behavior or leave the Library. If the unacceptable behavior continues, staff or volunteer will follow the policy for unattended children.

Unattended Children

Parents/caregivers are responsible for being aware of the Library's hours of operation. They also must keep in mind that the Library may close unexpectedly for reasons out of the control of staff, such as a power outage, loss of heat, inclement weather, etc. Children should know what to do should this occur. Under no circumstances will a Library staff member or volunteer transport a child home or to another location, even at the request of the parent/caregiver.

Parents dropping off children outside the Library should first ensure that the Library is open. The Library is not necessarily

open to the public when there are lights on in the building.

The Library is not responsible for children without a ride home at closing. If an unattended child is still in the Library at closing time, the child will be given a chance to call home for a ride 10 minutes before the Library closes. Staff will remain with the child up to 15 minutes after closing and will continue attempting to contact the parent/caregiver during that time. If no responsible adult is reached, the child is considered to be an abandoned child and the Sheriff's department will be contacted.

Staff will record the parent's/caregiver's name, address, telephone number and the child's name.

Each incident in which a child has been asked to leave the Library or in which an unattended child has been present after closing will be reported in writing to the Director and the Board of Trustees.

Violation of the Safe Child Policy may result in suspension of Library privileges for the family. Duration of suspension will be determined by the Library Director and the Library Board of Trustees.
