



BENZONIA PUBLIC LIBRARY AND PARTNERS RECEIVE \$50,000 FOR 2-YEAR LOCAL ORAL HISTORY PROJECT

Benzonia Public Library is honored to announce it has received an Institute of Museum and Library Services grant to partner with the Benzie Area Historical Society and Museum and Benzie County Central Schools to create a teen internship program focusing on oral histories relating to veterans, families, agriculture, and artisanship. Remembering Benzie: An Oral History Project will magnify and preserve one of our region's greatest assets: our people and their histories.

The \$50,000 grant will allow for the purchase of professional recording equipment and training from University of Michigan School of Information experts in the fields of interviewing and videography. Training sessions and access to technologies will first be directed to the Benzie Central High School student interns, but later in the course of the grant, these resources will be available to the community. The mission of this project is to collect, edit and archive high quality interviews of our community's older population, veterans, and anyone with a unique or interesting perspective of Benzie County and surrounding areas. The Benzie Area Historical Society will help archive and preserve these accounts and incorporate them in video exhibits in the museum. BAHS will also host theatrical screenings of the oral history videos.

Benzonia Public Library's mission statement is preserving yesterday, enriching today, inspiring tomorrow in our community. Director Amanda McLaren feels this project is an ideal way to meet that mission and support high schoolers in supporting their community. "Remembering Benzie is the ideal undertaking for BPL. We have a rich connection to both the history of our community and to the youth: our future. I am so excited to work with such great partners on this important program." McLaren continued, "We are grateful to IMLS for funding our vision and humbled by the idea that we can help give the citizens of Benzie County such a valuable gift in the form of preserved memories and shared histories."

The Institute of Museum and Library Services is the primary source of federal support for the nation's libraries and museums. They advance, support, and empower America's museums, libraries, and related organizations through grant making, research, and policy development. Their vision is a nation where museums and libraries work together to transform the lives of individuals and communities.

"As centers of learning and catalysts of community change, libraries and museums connect people with programs, services, collections, information, and new ideas in the arts, sciences, and humanities. They serve as vital spaces where people can connect with each other," said IMLS Director Dr. Kathryn K. Matthew. "IMLS is proud to support their work through our grant making as they inform and inspire all in their communities."

Remembering Benzie: An Oral History Project kicks off this fall with the selecting of high school student interns and their training, and will run for two years. 11th & 12th grade students that are interested in learning more about this opportunity should email director McLaren at benzonialibrary@gmail.com. Throughout the cycles of the grant, the library will be facilitating several phases of the project. These will include video, sound and interviewing technique training open to the public, family interviewing workshops, and interviewing at the Maples.





Master Gardeners Beautifying Benzonia

You may have noticed considerable improvement to the grounds of the Mills Community House. Commencing in 2017 a team of three Master Gardeners led by Steve Stephens (a member of the Mills House Board of Directors) have carried out a number of projects designed to beautify the property. Existing flower beds have been tidied up and new plantings have taken place. The installation of a sprinkler system has changed the lawns into lush green carpets. The two roadside flower beds fronting the property, whilst owned by the Village of Benzonia, have been incorporated into the garden design for the property. They were replanted with a variety of perennial plants to ensure color throughout the seasons, from daffodils in the spring to the autumn show of sedums. Tall daylilies taken from the roadside beds have been replanted to the rear of the property together with a fledgling row of lilac bushes. Others were transplanted along the southern bank of the parking lot. The team now cares for all of the village flower beds along US-31 and has cleaned up and replanted beds fronting the Academy Park and the by the Post Office parking lot. The aim is to establish a number of vigorous perennial/ pollinator gardens throughout the village.



New flower boxes fronting US-31 (from the Roadhouse corner) were acquired by Steve from the Lake Shores Garden Club when they updated the ones in Honor. They were donated to the village after being repaired and repainted. They look so vibrant thanks to almost daily watering done by the Village Clerk (and County Board Representative) Rhonda Nye and her husband Ken.

The initial Master Gardener team of Steve Stephens (Beulah), Sue Warren (Platte Lake) and Trish Early (Frankfort) have this year been joined by Master Gardeners Gary Michelak (Frankfort) and Sue Oseland (Elberta) and other gardeners Village President Tim Flynn and his wife Toni (Treasurer) and Alan & Gerry Chinavar (Beulah). Additionally a team of Benzie High Schoolers worked extremely hard on these beds and grounds in September 2018 and are again scheduled to assist in September 2019.
