Come to either or both sessions. Everyone is welcome.


#### STORIES THAT HEAL

## Save The Date - April 8, 2024 A Solar Eclipse Is Coming



**Did You Know?**An Eclipse Never
Comes Alone!

A solar eclipse always occurs about two weeks before or after a lunar eclipse. Usually, there are two eclipses in a row, but other times, there are three during the same eclipse season. The solar eclipse occurring on April 8, 2024 will be the second eclipse of the season, with the first eclipse, a Penumbral Lunar Eclipse, set to occur on March 25, 2024.

We encourage people to stop in throughout the month and discover (or re-discover!) the joy and power of books and reading! Whether you check out something new or snuggle in with a classic, share book titles with friends or read a book out loud to a child, spend some extra time reading this month!



#### 3 FUN WAYS TO TAKE READING ON THE GO

- Point out environmental print to your child this includes any time you see text outside your home - think street signs, posters in buildings, and even flyers at the grocery store.
- Grocery shopping can be a great way to encourage reading and writing. At the store, help your child figure out the first letter of specific brands. Then together go on a hunt to find foods from those brands.
- Bring a book Browsing and chatting about any book from the seat of a shopping cart is always a worthwhile activity for a toddler. It's especially fun to bring a title that relates to your errand. There are many choices, but we're partial to the classic characters in **Spot** Goes Shopping by Eric Hill or Maisy Goes Shopping by Lucy Cousins.

National Reading Month is celebrated in March. In this month people, especially children, read a lot more. An increase in reading has significant benefits that will continue to pay off in the future. Reading is one of the best habits to develop; it strengthens the mental muscles, helps to improve comprehension and analytical abilities, increases imagination & boosts memory.




